Annual fees for the 2024 academic year

## Parent and Friends

As the College does not conduct any fundraising events throughout the year, a voluntary levy is used by the Parents and Friends to run social events for all families and students. The levy will also fund important maintenance projects to ensure good quality facilities and surroundings including air conditioning, seating and shade areas.

## School Tours – Interstate and Overseas

Tours are a non-compulsory component of the curriculum. Costs will vary and will be

These fees are payable in advance and should be paid at the beginning of each session.

## PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS

Fees are charged annually, and a 'Statement of Account' is emailed to the school year. Further statements are issued throughout the year and are also available upon request.

Parents may choose one of the following options for payment of fees:

- Option 1** One-off payment (Tuition Fee Only) if paid by 31 March 2024.
- Option 2** Quarterly payments to be paid during the first week of each term.
- Option 3** 9 Monthly Instalments to be paid on the last working day of the month February to October.
- Option 4** 18 Fortnightly Instalments March to October.

New families are asked to complete the Accounts Receivable form and return no later than Friday 23 February 2024.

Existing families will automatically continue with the same arrangement from the previous year, unless the College is advised otherwise. ## Concessions

### Servite College Concession Scheme

For those students who are unable to pay for their fees at Servite, the College offers a concession on the annual tuition fee for holders of a Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Card. This concession is applied to the Fees Office and is not available at the beginning of the school year, or anytime you are issued with a new card.
